## 2013-2014 ACCESS SOCIAL ECOLOGY PROGRAM PEER MENTOR APPLICATION

**ACCESS Social Ecology** is an innovative retention and peer mentoring program in the School of Social Ecology that launched in Fall 2011. This school-based program was designed to assist new students (freshman, transfer) maximize their undergraduate experience at the university through the promotion of academic excellence, leadership development, and community engagement.

The ACCESS Social Ecology Program offers many benefits to mentees:

- -Receive year-long mentorship from a trained upper-division peer mentor.
- -Gain access to the Excellence Lab, a 24/7 study center and computer lab.
- -Regularly meet with an academic advisor to monitor academic progress and create individualized action plans.
- -Earn 2 units of Social Ecology 198 (P/NP) each quarter.
- -Attend quarterly workshops on topics such as time management, leadership, campus resources, diversity and social justice issues, and stress management. Meet university administrators who will serve as workshop presenters and facilitators.
- -Participate in quarterly service-learning projects focused on a particular critical issue. Past topics include hunger and homelessness issues in Orange County and protection of natural resources through individual stewardship.

## WHAT BENEFITS DO I GET AS A PEER MENTOR?

- -Earn **4 units of Social Ecology 199** (letter grade) during the 2013-2014 academic year. Topics covered include: retention and mentoring issues in higher education, leadership theories, service-learning, and community engagement.
- **-Explore educational and career goals**, especially for those interested in attending graduate or professional school and/or pursuing a career in public service (i.e., education, law, social work).
- **-Collaborate with peers** under the guidance of program director to assist with program development, assessment, evaluation, and marketing/communications.
- -Receive quarterly **training and development** opportunities that aid in your personal and leadership development.
- -Serve as a **positive role model** and assist new students with maximizing their full potential.
