When developing an academic plan it is helpful to keep the following in mind:

- Check assist.org to see what you've already satisfied at your community college
- Most school requirements (Crm/Law C7, PsyBeh 9 or 11ABC, SocEcol E8 or PP&D 4, SocEcol 10, 194W and 195) are offered every quarter.
- Upper division courses are typically offered once per year.
- It is a good idea to take core/group courses early in your academic career.
- Soc Ecol 195, Field Study, requires advanced planning. Make sure you understand the process at least 2 quarters PRIOR to the quarter you plan on taking SocEcol 195.
- SocEcol 10 is a prerequisite for SocEcol 194W and SE 195.
- Electives courses may be used to fulfill unit requirements to graduate and may be used to fulfill requirements for a second major, minor, research, study abroad, or UCDC/UC Sacramento.
- Per academic senate guidelines 1 unit = 3 hours of student workload/week, For a 4 unit class, you should expect to spend 12 hours per week engaged in the class to do well. This includes lectures, discussions, studying, projects, papers, review sessions, etc.

This plan assumes the following:

- 90 quarter units were transferred into UCI with IGETC Certification completed.
- American History and American Institutions requirements met upon admission.
- Soc Ecol 13 is satisfied with a transfer class in Statistics.
- Category I Upper Division Writing is met by earning a grade of "C" or higher in SE194W.

This plan is simply a suggestion for how to plan your courses; your schedule will vary based on course availability and your curricular needs. Advanced Placement or International Baccalaureate credit earned or Community College courses completed may affect the plan above.
