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Students may petition to have two (2) **Social Ecology 199** courses (total of 8 units) count toward upper-division major credit provided that the courses (a) were taken for a letter grade; (b) required a written term paper or research presentation at an academic conference; and (c) were taught by a Social Ecology faculty member whose name appears on a list maintained in the Office of Student Services. Students may also petition **graduate-level courses** (numbered 200-209) to fulfill upper-division major requirements.

- UCI General Education requirement and university requirements must be fulfilled.
- UCI's Residency Requirement must be met (36 of the last 45 units must be completed at UCI).
- All courses taken to fulfill school and major requirements must be taken for a letter grade with the exception of SocEcol195.
- Certification for the B.A. degree is dependent upon a 2.0 GPA in the overall, school, and upper-division major requirements.
