

Sample Criminology, Law and Society B.A. 2-year plan for transfer students

This plan assumes the following

- 105 quarter units (70 semester units) were transferred to UCI with a full UC IGETC.
- American History and Institutions requirements were met upon admission to UCI.

***Please note that this same plan is simply a suggestion for how to plan your courses. Your schedule will vary based on course availability and your curricular needs. AP or IB credit earned in high school or completed community college coursework may affect your specific plan.*

Keep in mind

- Not all classes are offered each quarter. You are encouraged to complete singular requirements without alternatives early on, in case it is not offered in the quarter in which you are planning to graduate.
- SocEcol 195, Field Study, requires advanced planning. Make sure you understand the process at least 2 quarters PRIOR to the quarter you plan on taking SocEcol 195.
 - o SocEcol 10 is a prerequisite for SocEcol 195.
- Upper division courses are numbered 100 - 199 (i.e. Crm/Law 101) and Lower division courses are numbered between 1-99 (i.e. Crm/Law C7). Your major consists of both lower division and upper division coursework.
- Per academic senate guidelines 1 unit = 3 hours of student workload per week. For a 4 unit course, you should expect to spend 12 hours per week engaged in the class to do well. This includes lectures, discussions, projects, papers, review sessions, office hours, etc.

California Community College coursework counts towards lower division credit only. Upper division transfer course credit from a prior university is subject to approval on a case by case basis.

- Upper Division Writing is met by earning a grade of “C” or higher in an upper division writing course.
- All school and major courses must be taken for a letter grade.
 - o School, major, and UC GPA must be at least 2.0 to be eligible for graduation

Total = 181 units. All B.A. requirements completed.

Note: a minimum of 180 quarter units is required in order to graduate.
