#### Freshman Year


- Develop a plan & a parallel plan
  - Classes you'll take, experiences you'll need
  - Get good grades and explore your options!
- Utilize your resources
  - Faculty, TA's, Academic Counselors, Peer Mentors, Campus Resources
  - OFFICE HOURS
- Take advantage of opportunities early and often

#### Sophomore Year

- · Explore research and internship opportunities
  - Be persistent!
  - Use your summers (summer research programs)
- Continue to develop relationships with faculty, TA's, and older undergrads
- Utilize the Career Center
  - Do you even NEED graduate school? Will it be worth it?
  - Go backwards explore the professions that interest you most and see what kind of education you need

#### **Junior Year**

- Start your search
  - Clarify your goals
    - What degree are you looking for?
    - · Master's vs PhD what's the difference?
  - · Visit schools/attend virtual fairs/reach out to admissions office
- · Use your summers to build your CV/resume
- Prepare for graduate school exams (GRE)
- Explore extramural fellowships (mostly for PhD, like NSF GRFP, Ford)

- · Are you a transfer student?
  - JUMP RIGHT IN!

#### **Senior Year**

#### Application season typically December-March

- Get organized (create chart with schools, deadlines, requirements, etc.)
  - · What do schools require?
  - Who will you be asking for letters of recommendation?
  - Take required exams (GRE? GRE Subject Test? GMAT?)
  - · Obtain fee waivers if needed
- · Narrow down programs & be realistic
  - Look at stats, some schools may have an Office of Institutional Research that regularly posts data
  - · Google "UCI OIR"

#### **Tips**

- Letters of Recommendation
  - Get them now (aim for 5), especially if you may apply in the future
    - Remember making those connections???
    - Can request to update in the future
  - · Give them 4-6 weeks
  - Provide information to your recommenders!
    - · CV/Resume, Statement of Purpose
  - · Follow up with them
    - · A thank you note is always appreciated
    - · Let them know of the outcome
- Taking a break?
  - · Make it meaningful

#### **FAQs**

- · What if my grades aren't great?
  - Focus on what you can change
  - Can explain poor grades and highlight improvement in statements
  - Take classes as a non-degree seeking student if you've already graduated
- · How do I prepare for the GRE?
  - Free test prep materials on GRE site
  - Take a practice test to figure out your weaknesses
  - https://camp.uci.edu/gre-prep/
- What if I take a LOT of time off?
  - Connect what you did professionally to pursuit of the graduate degree
  - · Volunteer with faculty on research projects
- · How do I pay for my degree?
  - · Grants, loans, fellowships
  - · PhD programs typically fully funded

#### **Application Requirements**

- Graduate Application online
  - <u>https://apply.grad.uci.edu/apply/</u>
- Application Fee
  - \$120 for US citizens/US Permanent Residents
  - \$140 for international applicants
  - Waivers for domestic applicants available
- Unofficial transcripts from each college or university attended after high school
  - Can now be uploaded online
  - 3.0 minimum undergraduate GPA to be eligible for admission

#### **Application Requirements**

- GRE is NOT required for the 2021 cycle
  - EXCEPT international students applying to the MPP
    - Can be waived if completed ALL undergraduate or graduate coursework in US or country where dominant language is English (manually verified via transcripts)

#### · TOEFL or IELTS

- Can be waived if completed ALL undergraduate or graduate coursework in US or country where dominant language is English (manually verified via transcripts)
- International PhD applicants HIGHLY encouraged to submit a TOEFL or IELTS
- TOEFL 80 minimum, Speak 26+
- IELTS 7 overall (no less than 6 on any section), Speak 8+

#### 3 letters of recommendation

- Link to upload sent directly to recommenders (check junk filter!)
- Statement of Purpose and Personal History

- Resume/CV required of some programs (MPP, MAS & MLFP)
